«Martha, Martha, you are worried and distracted by many things; there is need of only one thing.» (Lk 10, 41-42)

Jesus liked to stop and rest at the house of his friends, Martha, Mary and Lazarus. Martha was very organized and energetic, a strong woman with great faith.

As the head of the house, she was probably getting everything ready to make Jesus feel at home. Mary, her sister, instead of helping, was sitting there listening to what Jesus was saying.

Martha got a little upset and told Jesus to ask her sister to help her. Jesus answered her by saying:

«Martha, Martha, you are worried ...»
