BRUSSELS (Belgium)

A CELEBRATION OF UNITY AMONG DIFFERENT RELIGIONS

We are a **group of teens from Belgium** and for the past three years we have sponsored a project to bring together people of different cultures and languages in our region. We call it **“Together for peace.”**

In the big cities of our country, there are many Muslims who have immigrated here from Morocco, Turkey and the Balkan countries of southeastern Europe. This year we organized an event in Brussels called **“Concert for Fraternity”** and the **whole program was prepared by Muslims and Christians working together**.

The goal of the concert was to tell people about our commitment to living for a united world.

All of us - children and teens of both religions and of various languages - worked hard on the day of the event. We prepared a sack lunch for each participant, respecting the dietary laws of each group. We also had **a game for everyone to play as an icebreaker and to dispel any preconceived notions or fears**. It was a great way to go out to others and get to know and respect them. Other groups also contributed to the concert, with choirs and professional singers. They were Muslim and Christian groups, speaking French, Dutch and German. It was **an invitation to enter into the culture of the other person**.

450 people came. Important persons such as the Belgian Secretary of State, the National Minister of Education, the President of the Executive Board of Muslims (an official organ of the Belgian government), the President of Religions for Peace of Europe, several Islamic theologians and a young Egyptian Christian who is studying in Belgium for his doctorate **What struck the participants the most was the sense of brotherhood among all**, which increased as the day progressed and which many had never experienced before.

«We speak different languages and have different religious beliefs,” some of the teenagers said, “and yet **our diversity does not stop us from living together and building peace**. It was a very strong experience! We hope to sponsor many more events like this so that we can spread unity all over our country.”
