"If Jesus is present in everyone in some way, then we cannot make distinctions or discriminate against anyone. We can't have any preferences. We cannot love only some people and not others.

"We can no longer classify people as a fellow citizen or a foreigner, as young or old, ugly or pretty, nice or nasty.

## OUR NEIGHBOR IS **OUR PATH** TO GOD

"It is **Jesus** who lives in each one of them. Every neighbor, every person we meet is «another Jesus» to be loved.

"Living like this we realize that our neighbor is our path to God. In fact, every person is like an archway that we have to pass under in order to reach God."
