He was surprised at my greeting, because he was expecting me to be angry about what happened the day before.

But this time, after taking the step to forgive him, not only was my anger toward him gone, but I wasn't even sad anymore and I felt free to love him.





"But God, who is rich in mercy, out of the great love with which he loved us even when we were dead through our trespasses, made us alive together with Christ." (Eph. 2:4-5)

These words of the Apostle Paul to the Ephesians refers to the Old Testament when the Lord God appeared to Moses on Mount Sinai and told him that he will always be merciful toward the people.

What does "merciful" mean??

It means that God loves us like a mother loves her child. He cares for us, protects us, is always with us.

We can <u>all</u> experience his great love! He is ready to forgive us every time we fail and is confident that we will start over again.

It makes me think of many parables in the Gospel, like the Good Samaritan or the Prodigal Son.


If God Loves us like this, and if he loves those who are bad, and are his enemies, we too have to learn how to love those who are not lovable.
